

Visa | Regular Passport

In order to apply for Argentine visa, please follow these instructions:

1 | Find out whether or not you need visa to enter Argentina.

-Holders of Swedish regular passports do not need visa to enter Argentina as tourists or to conduct business or unpaid cultural or artistic activities, provided that the length of stay in Argentina is up to 90 days.

They do require visa when they intend to conduct other activities as well as when they expect to receive a payment and when the length of stay in Argentina will be longer than 90 days.

The passport used to enter Argentina must be still valid for at least 6 months counting from the arrival date.

-Holders of passports issued by states other than Sweden may check out [APPENDIX I | Passports that require Argentine visa](#) [at the end of these instructions] to find out whether or not they need visa.

If you need Argentine visa, go to **2**.

2 | Find out the type and category of visa that you need and the Argentine Embassy or Consulate where you must apply for it.

To that end, check out [APPENDIX II | Visa types](#) [at the end of these instructions].

If you must apply for visa at the Argentine Embassy in Sweden, go to **3**.

If you must apply for visa at another Argentine Embassy or Consulate, please contact that office directly.

3 | Gather all the documents required to apply for the visa that you need.

To find out the documents required, check out [APPENDIX III | Required documents](#) [at the end of these instructions].

In all cases, one of such documents is the visa application form, which you can download going back to the main page of consular procedures.

4 | Email your visa application to consulares_esuec@mrecic.gov.ar. Attach to the e-mail scanned copy of your passport (two first pages) and visa application form (first page).

Note [A]: the visa application e-mail must be received at least 15 days before your departure date from Sweden if you hold a Swedish passport and at least 60 days before if you hold a passport issued by states other than Sweden.

Note [B]: in some cases, an inviting party from Argentina may have already submitted your visa application at the Immigration Department (Dirección Nacional de Migraciones). If so, just inform this circumstance in your e-mail.

5 | Wait to receive the Embassy's feedback. Embassy staff will call you the following working day from 10:00 to 12:00 to make an appointment for visa interview.

If according to APPENDIX III | Required documents you need an invitation letter sent by an inviting party in Argentina to the Embassy and the letter has not yet been received, the Embassy will email you back to inform that the visa procedure will be suspended until the reception of the letter.

6 | Attend the interview appointment bringing along the originals of all documents needed for the visa applied for according to APPENDIX III | Required documents.

Embassy staff will examine the documents and will later require you to pay the visa fee at SEB branch (walking distance from the Embassy).

The fee to be paid will be the amount in SEK equivalent to the amount in USD stated in APPENDIX II | Visa types at the exchange rate valid on the payment day. The exact SEK amount will be informed by the Embassy.

Note that it is under your responsibility to submit at the Embassy all the documents required for your visa according to APPENDIX III | Required documents. If any of the documents is missing, the application will be suspended until the submission of the documentation.

7 | Upon payment, you must return to the Embassy to submit the payment receipt and attend the consular interview.

If you hold a Swedish passport, the Embassy will inform you whether the visa has been approved or rejected right after the interview. If approved, it will also require your passport to stamp the visa.

If you do not hold a Swedish passport, in some cases the Embassy will only inform you the date in which the decision will be communicated. This communication will be made by phone and also by e-mail.

Note: in case of temporary or permanent visa, prior to the issuance of the visa you will be required to pay an additional immigration tax of USD 600 and a settlement fee of USD 100.

The immigration tax must be paid online by credit card following the instructions that can be found on the main page of consular procedures.

The settlement fee must be paid in SEK at the branch of SEB bank close to the Embassy. The exact amount will be determined according to the exchange rate SEK/USD on the payment day and will be informed by the Embassy.

Applicants for work & holiday visa are exempted to pay both taxes.

Members of religions officially recognized in Argentina are exempted to pay this tax, as well as applicants under 18 years old who will travel with their parents and applicants for whom a third party has started visa application in Argentina.

The settlement fee must be paid in SEK at the SEB branch near the Embassy. The exact amount will be determined by the exchange rate SEK/USD on the payment date and will be informed by the Embassy.

Holders of temporary or permanent visa must apply for the Argentine ID at the Dirección Nacional de Migraciones (Immigration Department) in Argentina within 60 days counting from arrival date.

APPENDIX I | Passports that require Argentine visa

Holders of passports issued by the following states require to visa to enter Argentina in all cases:

Afghanistan, Albania, Algeria, Angola, Antigua and Barbuda, Azerbaijan, Bahamas, Bahrain, Bangladesh, Belize, Benin, Belarus, Bhutan, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Botswana, Brunei, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Cambodia, Cameroon, Cape Verde, Chad, China ¹, Central African Republic, Comoros Islands, Congo Brazaville, Congo (Democratic Republic), Cuba, Djibouti, Dominica, Dominican Republic, Egypt, Equatorial Guinea, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Fiji, Gabon, Gambia, Georgia, Ghana, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, India, Indonesia, Iraq, Iran, Ivory Coast, Jordan, Kazakhstan, Kenya, Kiribati, Kyrgyzstan, Kuwait, Laos, Lebanon, Lesotho, Liberia, Libya, Macau, Madagascar, Malawi, Maldives, Mali, Marshall Islands, Mauritania, Mauritius, Micronesia, Moldova, Mongolia, Morocco, Mozambique, Myanmar, Namibia, Nepal, Niger, Nigeria, North Korea, Oman, Pakistan, Palau, Palestine, Papua New Guinea, Philippines, Qatar, Rwanda, Sao Tome and Principe, Saudi Arabia, Senegal, Seychelles, Sierra Leone, Solomon Islands, Somalia, Sri Lanka, Sudan, Swaziland, Syria, Tajikistan, Tanzania, Timor Leste, Togo, Tunisia, Turkmenistan, Uganda, United Arab Emirates, Uzbekistan, Vanuatu, Vietnam, Yemen, Western Samoa and Zimbabwe.

¹ Holders of Chinese passports that have a valid B2 US visa or Schengen visa do not need visa to enter Argentina as tourists. Instead, they must obtain an Electronic Travel Authorization (ETA) online at: www.migraciones.gov.ar/accesible/indexP.php?reciprocidad

Holders of passports issued by the following states do not require visa to enter Argentina when they travel in the capacity of tourists:

Andorra, Armenia, Australia, Austria, Barbados, Belgium, Bolivia, Brazil, Bulgaria, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Ecuador, El Salvador, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Granada, Greece, Guatemala, Guyana, Haiti, Holy See, Honduras, Hong Kong [passport B.N.O], Hong Kong [passport R.A.E.H.K], Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Israel, Italy, Japan, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Macedonia, Malaysia, Malta, Mexico, Monaco, Montenegro, Nicaragua, Norway, New Zealand, Netherlands, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Russia, St. Kitts and Nevis, Saint Lucia, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, San Marino, Serbia, Singapore, Slovakia, Slovenia, South Africa, South Korea, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Suriname, Thailand, Trinidad and Tobago, Turkey, Ukraine, United Kingdom, United States [including Puerto Rico], Uruguay and Venezuela.

Holders of these visa-free passports can stay in Argentina for up to 90 days. Exceptions: Granada, Hong Kong [passport B.N.O], Jamaica (30 days) and Venezuela (60 days).

Holders of passports issued by the following states do not require visa to enter Argentina when they travel to conduct business-related activities:

Armenia, Australia, Barbados, Belgium, Brazil, Bulgaria, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Granada, Guyana, Hong Kong [passport B.N.O], Hong Kong [passport R.A.E.H.K], Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Japan, Latvia, Lithuania, Malaysia, New Zealand, Nicaragua, Norway, Netherlands, Poland, Romania, Russia, St. Kitts and Nevis, Saint Lucia, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Singapore, Slovenia, South Africa, South Korea, Sweden, Suriname, Thailand, Trinidad and Tobago, Turkey, Ukraine, United Kingdom and United States [including Puerto Rico].

Holders of these passports can stay in Argentina for up to 90 days. Exceptions: Granada and Hong Kong [B.N.O] (30 days).
