

Holders of passports issued by the following states require visa to enter Argentina **in all cases**:

Afghanistan, Albania, Algeria, Angola, Antigua and Barbuda, Azerbaijan, Bahamas, Bahrain, Bangladesh, Belize, Benin, Belarus, Bhutan, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Botswana, Brunei, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Cambodia, Cameroon, Cape Verde, Chad, China ¹, Central African Republic, Comoros Islands, Congo Brazaville, Congo (Democratic Republic), Cuba, Djibouti, Dominica, Dominican Republic, Egypt, Equatorial Guinea, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Fiji, Gabon, Gambia, Georgia, Ghana, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, India, Indonesia, Iraq, Iran, Ivory Coast, Jordan, Kazakhstan, Kenya, Kiribati, Kyrgyzstan, Kuwait, Laos, Lebanon, Lesotho, Liberia, Libya, Macau, Madagascar, Malawi, Maldives, Mali, Marshall Islands, Mauritania, Mauritius, Micronesia, Moldova, Mongolia, Morocco, Mozambique, Myanmar, Namibia, Nepal, Niger, Nigeria, North Korea, Oman, Pakistan, Palau, Palestine, Papua New Guinea, Philippines, Qatar, Rwanda, Sao Tome and Principe, Saudi Arabia, Senegal, Seychelles, Sierra Leone, Solomon Islands, Somalia, Sri Lanka, Sudan, Swaziland, Syria, Tajikistan, Tanzania, Timor Leste, Togo, Tunisia, Turkmenistan, Uganda, United Arab Emirates, Uzbekistan, Vanuatu, Vietnam, Yemen, Western Samoa and Zimbabwe.

¹ Holders of Chinese passports that have a valid B2 US visa or Schengen visa do not need visa to enter Argentina as tourists. Instead, they must obtain an Electronic Travel Authorization (ETA) online at: www.migraciones.gov.ar/accesible/indexP.php?reciprocidad

Holders of passports issued by the following states **do not require visa** to enter Argentina **as tourists**:

Andorra, Armenia, Australia, Austria, Barbados, Belgium, Bolivia, Brazil, Bulgaria, Canada¹, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Ecuador, El Salvador, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Granada, Greece, Guatemala, Guyana, Haiti, Holy See, Honduras, Hong Kong [passport B.N.O], Hong Kong [passport R.A.E.H.K], Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Israel, Italy, Japan, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Macedonia, Malaysia, Malta, Mexico, Monaco, Montenegro, Nicaragua, Norway, New Zealand, Netherlands, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Russia, St. Kitts and Nevis, Saint Lucia, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, San Marino, Serbia, Singapore, Slovakia, Slovenia, South Africa, South Korea, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Suriname, Thailand, Trinidad and Tobago, Turkey, Ukraine, United Kingdom, United States [including Puerto Rico], Uruguay and Venezuela.

¹ Although they do not need visa to enter Argentina as tourists, holders of Canadian passports must pay a Reciprocity Fee prior to their entrance to the country. Payment instructions can be found here: http://www.migraciones.gov.ar/pdf_varios/reciprocidad/Online_payment_instructions.pdf

Holders of these visa-free passports can stay in Argentina for up to 90 days. Exceptions: Granada, Hong Kong [passport B.N.O], Jamaica (30 days) and Venezuela (60 days).

Holders of passports issued by the following states **do not require visa** to enter Argentina when they travel **to conduct business-related activities**:

Armenia, Australia, Barbados, Belgium, Brazil, Bulgaria, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Granada, Guyana, Hong Kong [passport B.N.O], Hong Kong [passport R.A.E.H.K], Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Japan, Latvia, Lithuania, Malaysia, New Zealand, Nicaragua, Norway, Netherlands, Poland, Romania, Russia, St. Kitts and Nevis, Saint Lucia, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Singapore, Slovenia, South Africa, South Korea, Sweden, Suriname, Thailand, Trinidad and Tobago, Turkey, Ukraine, United Kingdom and United States [including Puerto Rico].

Holders of these passports can stay in Argentina for up to 90 days. Exceptions: Granada and Hong Kong [B.N.O] (30 days).
